### The David Jaggs Library

The **David Jaggs Library** houses an excellent collection of **articles, periodicals, books, journals and audio/visual materials pertaining to young people aged 12 to 24 years.**

The collection of resources is **continually expanding** and undergoes diligent updating. The materials **reflect THC's preventative, wholistic approach** to adolescent health and social issues,

Young people, parents, teachers, students, clergy, medical professionals and youth leaders are invited to delve into our collection of **physiological, sociological, theological and psychological resources.** A library assistant is on hand to assist you in finding pertinent information.

The library is **open to the public from 3 to 5 p.m. on weekdays.** If you wish to view our collection at another time, you may visit **by appointment**, arranged with the librarian,

Materials may be read or viewed in the library. Members of the community may borrow books or audio/visual materials with the approval of the librarian. Periodicals, reference documents, newspaper articles and archive materials are available for reading in the library, but they do not circulate.

**Resources may be photocopied in the library** for a nominal charge.

Borrowers assume financial responsibility for lost or damaged materials.

All re-shelving is done by the volunteer library staff.

The David Jaggs Library was founded in memory of **Richard David Jaggs** son of the founding director of the Centre Reverend Dr. W.K. Jaggs SSC and his wife, Leda.

David was killed by a drunken driver on October 4, 1989 in Los Angeles, California, where he was a pre-law student.

Families, friends and associates responded to the tragedy with donations, which were collected in a trust fund. This fund finances the library and continues to maintain it.

In the spirit of remembrance, **donations are often given in the memory of a loved one.** A memorial plate is placed in each memorial book.

**Income tax receipts may be issued** for monetary donations, donated material and for fair market value of books which are deemed suitable for the library.

Since space in the library is limited, the librarian reserves the right to decline acceptance of any donated materials. Donated resources become the property of the David Jaggs Library.
